Directions to Fairfield Medical Center:

- **From the West (Columbus):** From I-70 -Merge onto US-33 E via EXIT 105A toward LANCASTER. 17.0 mi
Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto US-33-BR/ COLUMBUS LANCASTER RD NW/ CR-33A E/ LANCASTER BUSINESS ROUTE. 0.1 mi
- Stay STRAIGHT to go onto US-33-BR/ COLUMBUS LANCASTER RD NW/ CR-33A E/ LANCASTER BUSINESS ROUTE. Continue to follow US-33-BR/ LANCASTER BUSINESS ROUTE. 7.3 mi
- Turn LEFT onto W MAIN ST/ US-22 . Continue to follow W MAIN ST/ US-22. 1.2 mi.
- Turn LEFT onto EWING ST. Fairfield Medical Center is on the LEFT.
Pass by the first entrance and proceed to the EMERGENCY entrance. This is also the entrance to the parking garage. Parking in the garage is free.
Take the elevator to the Second Floor. Signs will direct you to Assembly. Rooms 1 & 5.
- **From the East (Zanesville):** Take I-70 west and Merge onto SR 37/south LANCASTER EXIT. This takes you into Lancaster at Rising Park.
- Turn LEFT onto W MAIN ST/ US-22 . Continue to follow W MAIN ST/ US-22. 1.2 mi
- Turn LEFT onto EWING ST. Fairfield Medical Center is on the LEFT.
Pass by the first entrance and proceed to the EMERGENCY entrance. This is also the entrance to the parking garage. Parking in the garage is free.
Take the elevator to the Second Floor. Signs will direct you to Assembly. Rooms 1 & 5.
